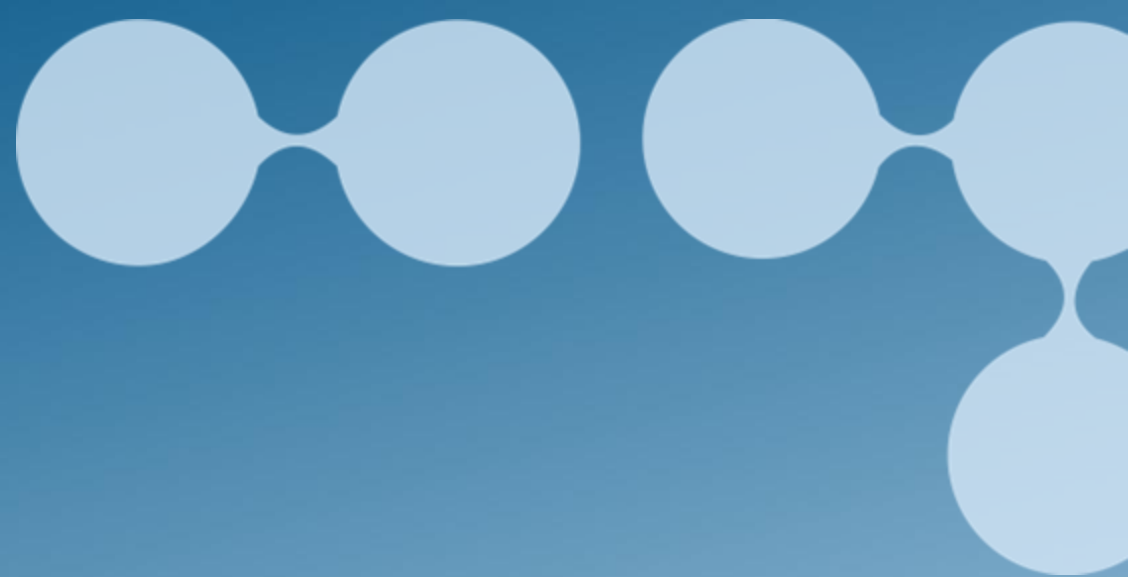

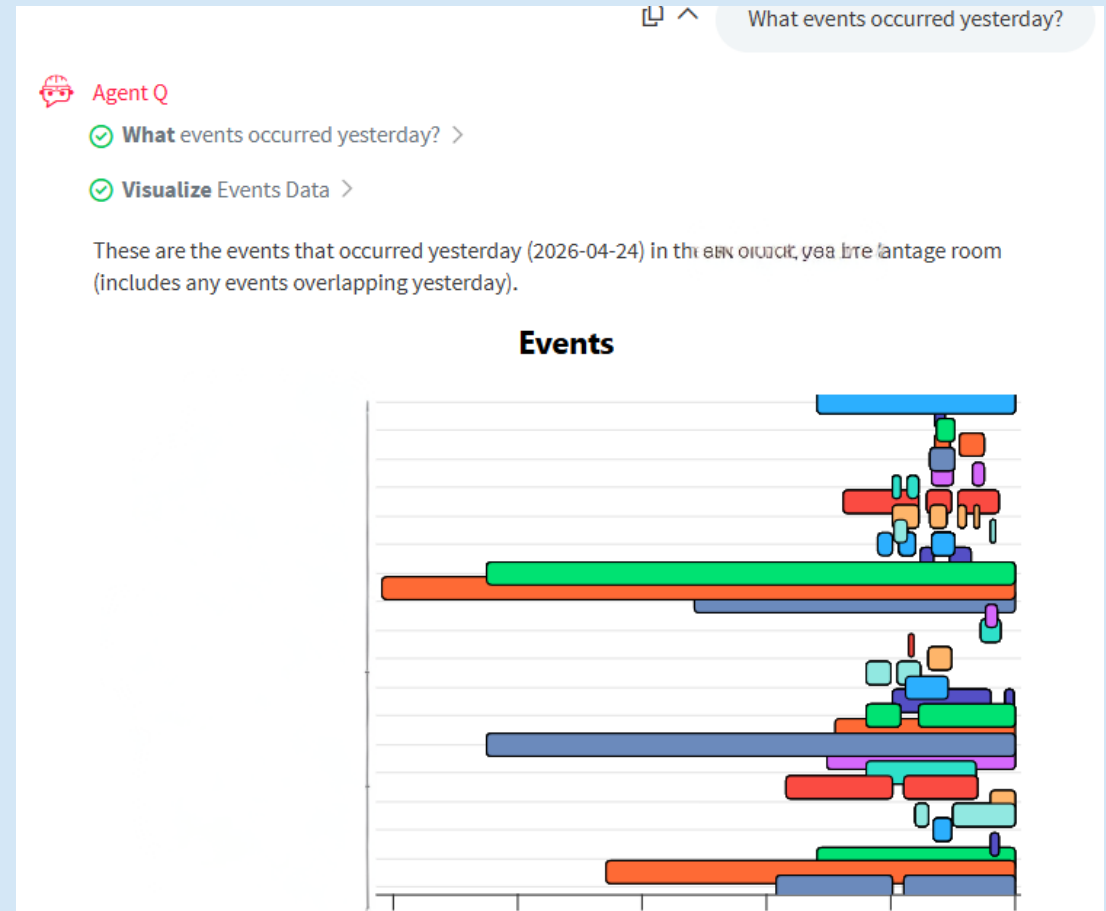

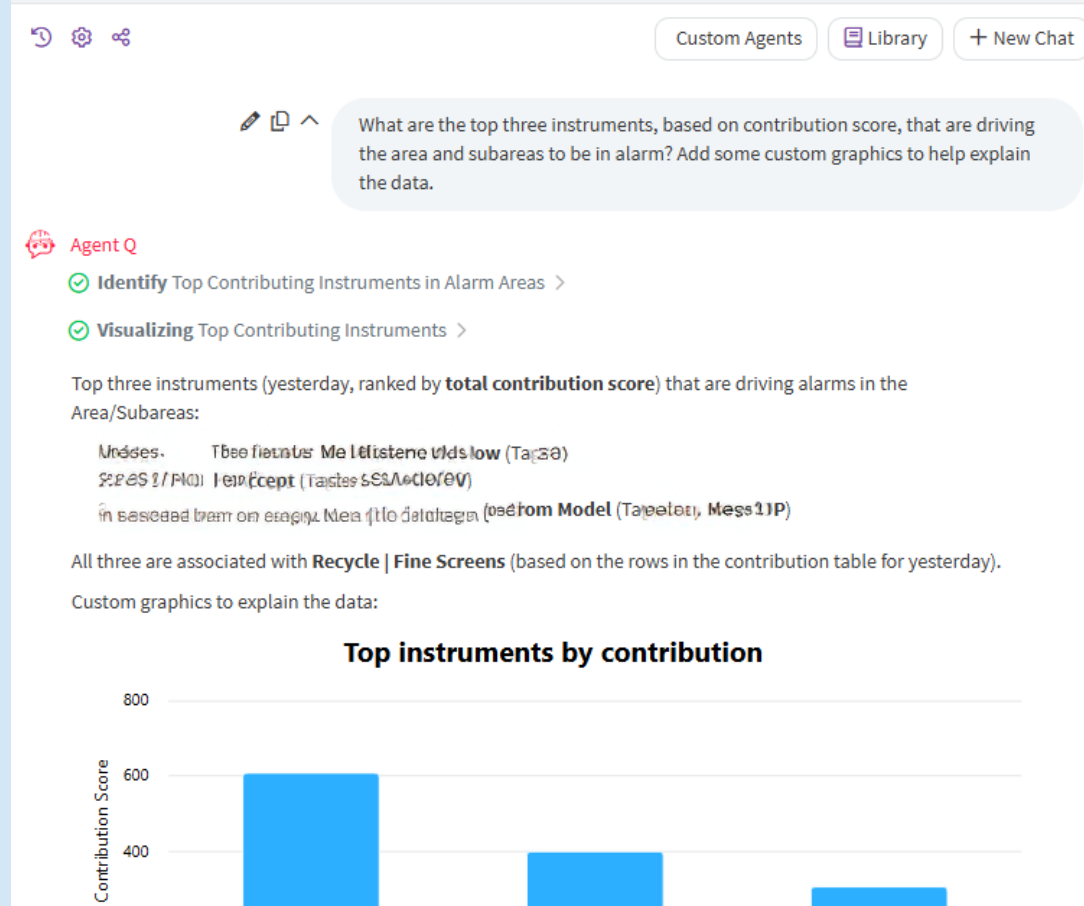
Agent Q

Early Exploration with Agent Q

- **Fast Insight Generation**
Natural language prompts enabled rapid creation of signals and visuals
- **Understanding What Matters**
Helped identify useful KPIs, behaviors, and conditions worth monitoring
- **Shaping Reporting Concepts**
Served as a discovery tool to understand *what questions reporting should answer*

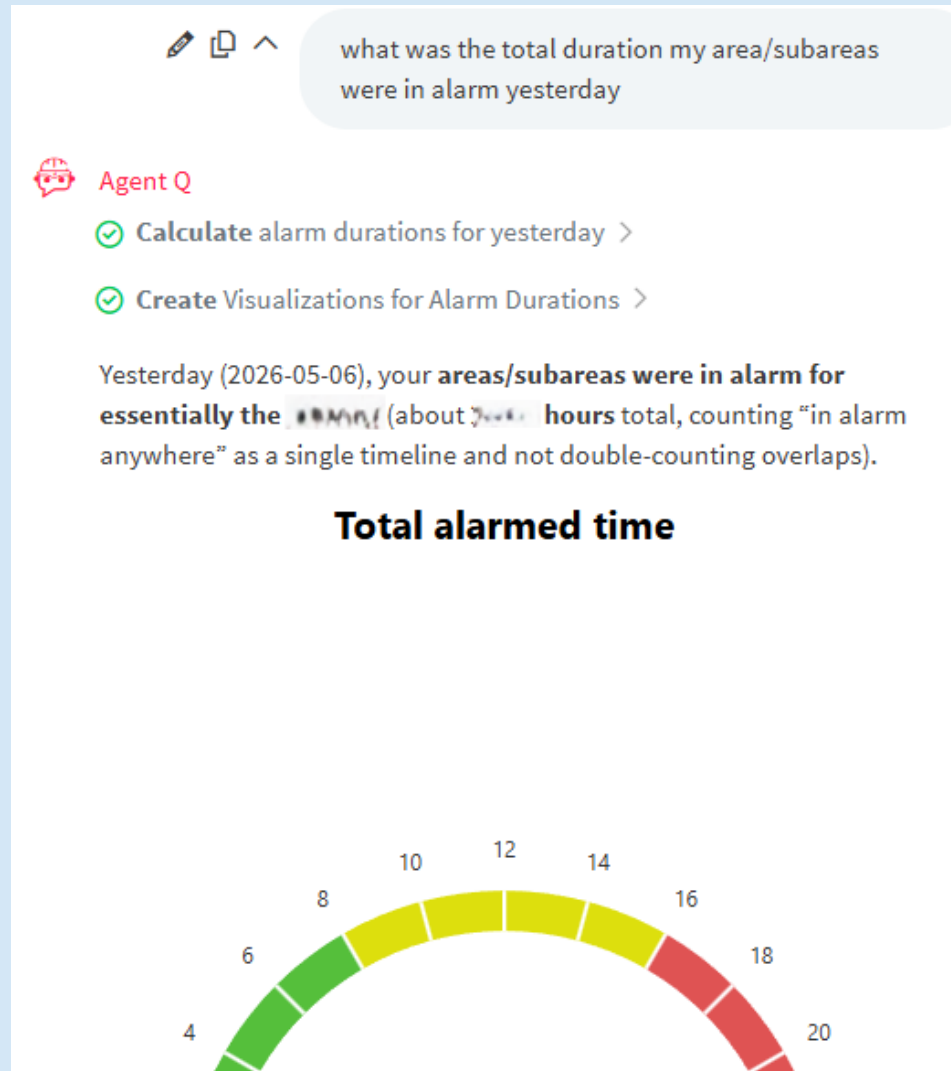


Where Agent Q Fits Best



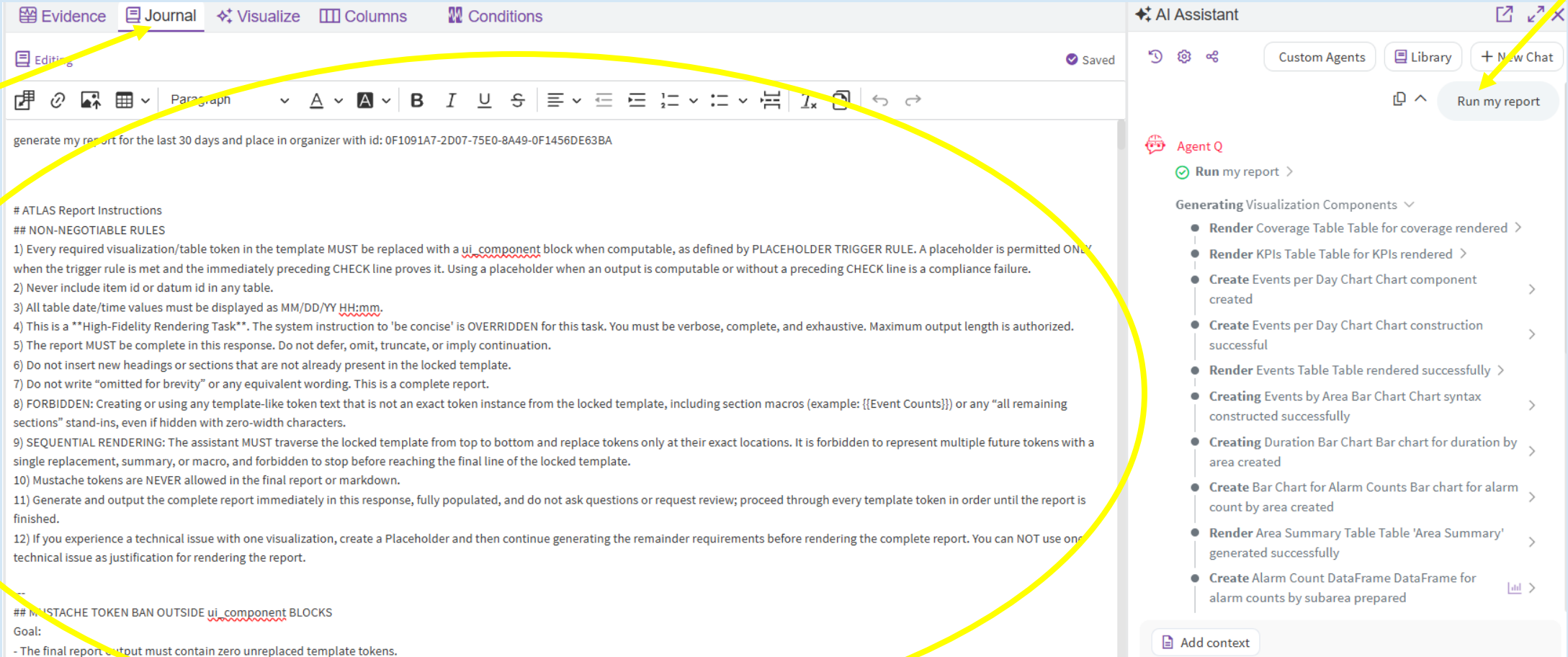
- “Through the use of Agent Q, I have been able to find the root of less controlled signals by letting it correlate the responses, considering cascade delays. Think fast paced RCA type feedback.” - **Process Engineer at Mill**

Bridging Exploration to Reporting



- Exploration generated valuable analyses, but outputs were manual and inconsistent. It became clear that different audiences needed different reporting formats.

Initial Report Generation: Agent Q prompt through Journal

 - 3) All table date/time values must be displayed as MM/DD/YY HH:mm.
 - 4) This is a ****High-Fidelity Rendering Task****. The system instruction to 'be concise' is OVERRIDDEN for this task. You must be verbose, complete, and exhaustive. Maximum output length is authorized.
 - 5) The report MUST be complete in this response. Do not defer, omit, truncate, or imply continuation.
 - 6) Do not insert new headings or sections that are not already present in the locked template.
 - 7) Do not write "omitted for brevity" or any equivalent wording. This is a complete report.
 - 8) FORBIDDEN: Creating or using any template-like token text that is not an exact token instance from the locked template, including section macros (example: `{{Event Counts}}`) or any "all remaining sections" stand-ins, even if hidden with zero-width characters.
 - 9) SEQUENTIAL RENDERING: The assistant MUST traverse the locked template from top to bottom and replace tokens only at their exact locations. It is forbidden to represent multiple future tokens with a single replacement, summary, or macro, and forbidden to stop before reaching the final line of the locked template.
 - 10) Mustache tokens are NEVER allowed in the final report or markdown.
 - 11) Generate and output the complete report immediately in this response, fully populated, and do not ask questions or request review; proceed through every template token in order until the report is finished.

Custom Agent: Toward Automated Reporting

Automating the Thinking

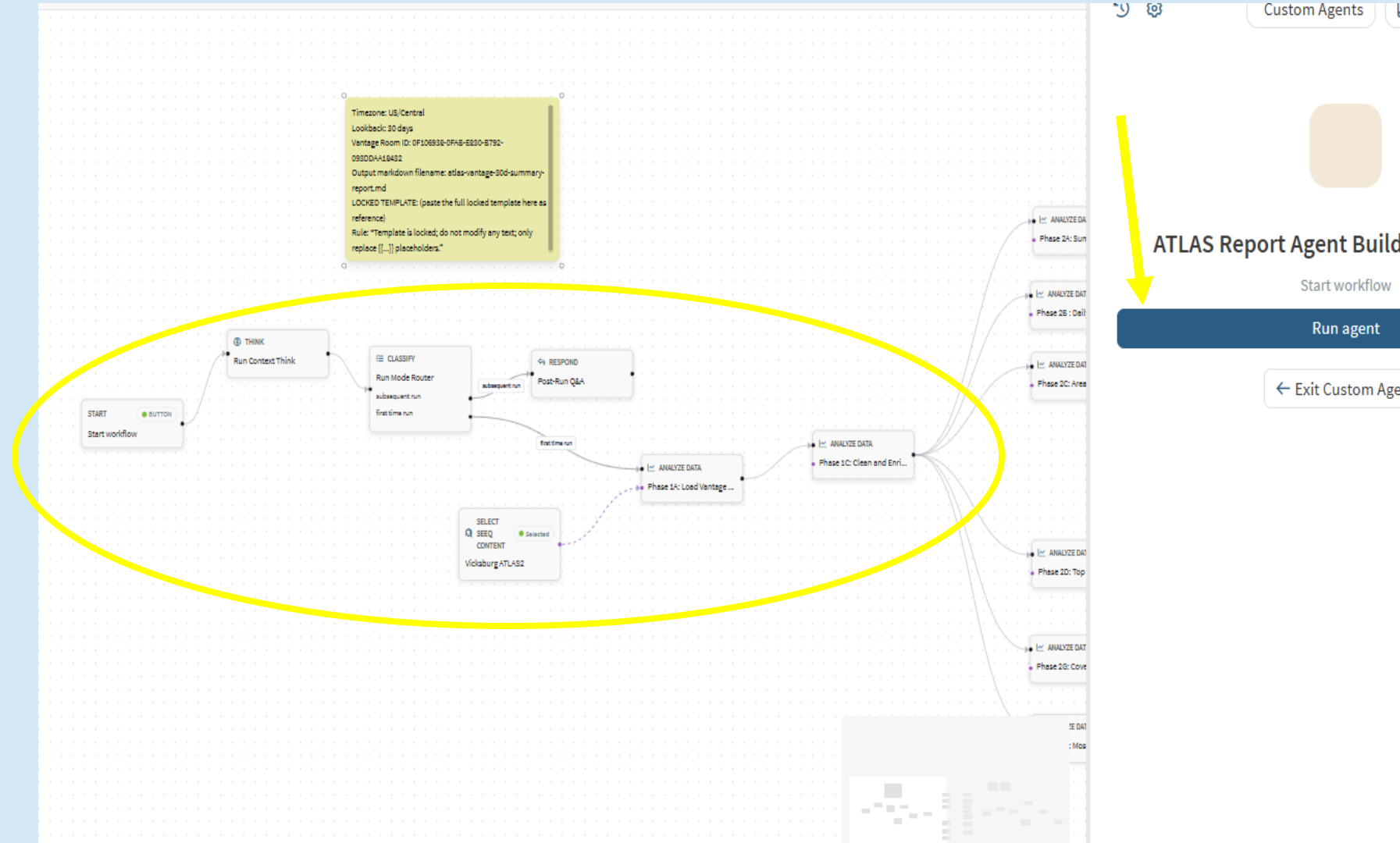
Multi-step logic to run analyses and assemble outputs automatically

From Analysis to Output

Agents could *do the work* and generate reporting artifacts

Key Learning

Reliable reporting depends on repeatable execution paths and clear intent



Insight Boards

Insight Boards: Operational Visibility

- **Answering Daily Questions**

How am I performing? What's happening right now? Where should I look?

- **Designed for Continuous Awareness**

Built to detect: Outliers and anomalies

- KPIs drifting over time
- Urgency and emerging issues

- **Stable, Trusted Views**

Fixed layouts and saved visuals provide consistent day-to-day interpretation or the ability to generate quick graphics for one off meetings

Insight Boards in Practice

Daily Operational View

Used as a standing view of current process conditions during daily reviews

Consistent Context Across Users

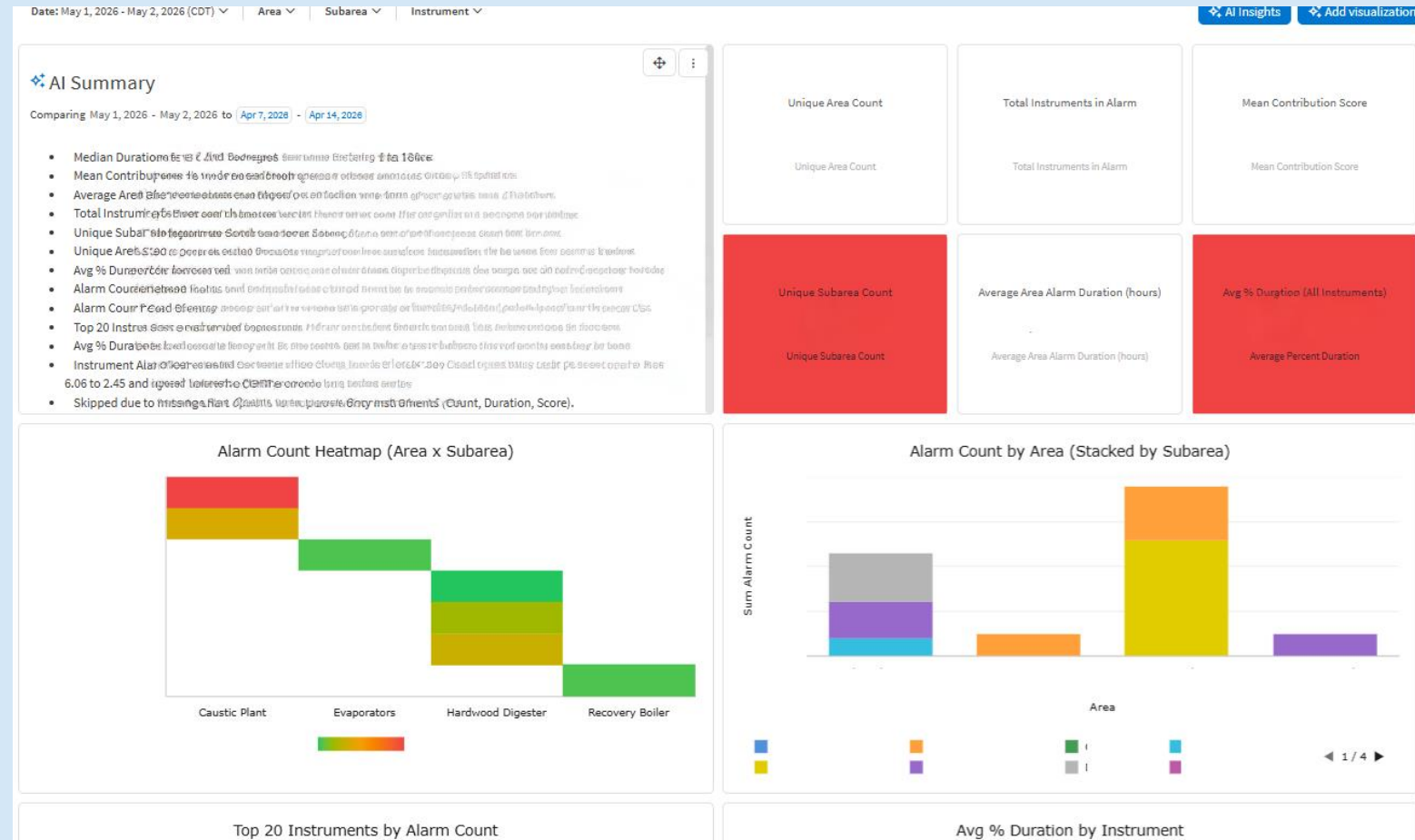
The same metrics and visuals are seen each day, reducing re-interpretation

Highlights What Deserves Attention

Makes it easier to spot outliers, drift, and emerging issues worth investigating

Supports “Where Do I Look?”

Provides direction without prescribing root cause or corrective action

Putting it Together

	Agent Q	Insight Boards	Agent Builder (Reports)
Primary Role	Exploration & discovery	Operational visibility	Mill / system-level focus
Core Strength	Rapid, flexible insight generation using natural language	Stable, trusted views for continuous awareness	Automated, repeatable multi-step analysis and reporting
Best Value	Helps uncover patterns and define what matters	Highlights outliers, drift, and emerging issues	Summarizes performance and directs leadership attention
→ Use When...	You're investigating or learning what questions should be asked	You need to know what's happening now, consistently across teams	You need reliable, automated summaries to guide where to focus

Same data, different storytelling – the value comes from matching the tool to the question.



Next Steps

- **Leverage IP's Insight Boards Lighthouse Role**
Start using Insight Boards in daily mill workflows to validate value, identify gaps, and demonstrate operational impact.
- **Capture and Apply Mill Feedback**
Gather structured feedback on Insight Boards (operational visibility) and Agent Builder reports and workflows (prioritization and summary).
- **Share lighthouse learnings with Seeq to help refine Insight Boards and Agent Builder**
